Frame Nation opens Frostick abstract show

The gallery at Frame Nation has opened "Pattern Recognition," a show of abstract works by Dana Frostick.

The show consists of drawings and paintings, including pieces completed in 2010. "Frostick's works come largely from her subconscious," said Frame Nation owner Mary Fender. "She doesn't name the pieces until she sees them in their finished form, listening to what the works suggest to her."

Born and raised in Richmond, Frostick began painting as a teenager

and before studying sculpture at Virginia Commonwealth University in the mid-'80s. Her works have been exhibited in solo and group shows in Richmond and throughout the state as well as in cities such as New York and Washington.

The exhibition, which opened Friday, runs through Aug. 14 at 11 S. 15th St. Hours are Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
